

JANUARY–APRIL 2026 PROJECT UPDATE

We opened our project on **5th January 2026** after a very successful year in 2025. We had closed on **22nd December 2025**.

In addition to paying school fees and feeding our children both at our school and at our partner schools, we undertook several other activities from January through April:

a) Grade 10 Placement

In 2025, we had 34 children who sat for their Grade 9 final examinations through our project. Thirty were from our school, **Live and Learn Education Center**, and four were from our partner public schools. This was the first Grade 9 class to sit for the final examinations.

All 34 children passed very well. At the end of January, we placed all of them in senior secondary schools. Thirty joined boarding schools across the Republic of Kenya, while four joined local public day secondary schools. All school fees and boarding requirements were provided by our project.

We thank our sponsors for making this possible through their generous donations.

b) Auditing Report

It is a government requirement for all Public Benefits Organizations (PBOs) to submit their annual returns by June of the following financial year. Previously, returns had to be submitted by the end of March, but under the new Act, they are now due in June.

We began the process in January, and by the beginning of March, we had successfully submitted our returns. Our auditing is carried out by **PEDO and Associates**.

c) Form 4 Results

In 2025, we had 40 children who sat for their Form 4 examinations. Out of this number, 18 qualified to join university, while 22 will be joining colleges and vocational training institutions.

Those joining colleges will begin in May this year, while those who qualified for university will begin in September.

d) School uniforms

We provide school uniforms for all our children, from Day Care through high school. We produce high-quality uniforms in our tailoring workshop. We also provide school shoes and socks.
